LPCAAA Members Instrumental in Apprehending Hit and Run Suspect

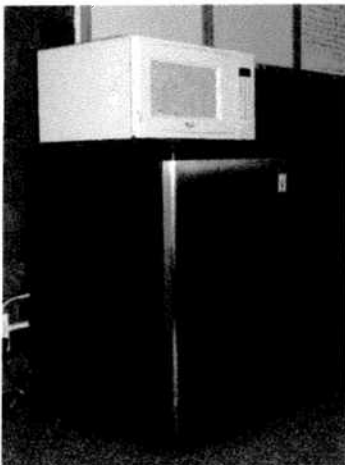
A tragic accident occurred late one evening in mid-June that sent one man to the hospital in critical condition and another man running from the law. Nicholas Patrick, confined to a wheelchair five years ago due to multiple sclerosis, was tragically run down by a hit and run driver while on his way home from a concert in Denver. Officer Jenny Geiser miraculously came upon Mr. Patrick that evening and helped him until medical personnel arrived. Police were able to recover evidence at the crime scene that would help identify the vehicle and, ultimately, the suspect.

Norm and Janet Sothan were instrumental in organizing a group of kids, members of the First Jobs organization, to distribute flyers to the community asking for assistance in locating the vehicle and/or driver of the vehicle in this crime. Mickey and Mike Kempf of Bradford Auto Body in Littleton assisted police in examining the evidence from the crime scene and were able to provide critical information by identifying the year, make, and model of the vehicle. With this vital information included in the flyers distributed by the kids from First Jobs, the Littleton Police Department received a tip a few days later regarding the possible whereabouts of the vehicle. This tip led to the apprehension of the alleged driver of the vehicle.

Although a tragic crime has occurred and a devastating tragedy has befallen Mr. Patrick and his family, the great citizenship and volunteerism of our community members helped bring this case one step closer to being solved. Thanks to everyone involved from the LPCAAA that gave of themselves to help our community when it was in need.

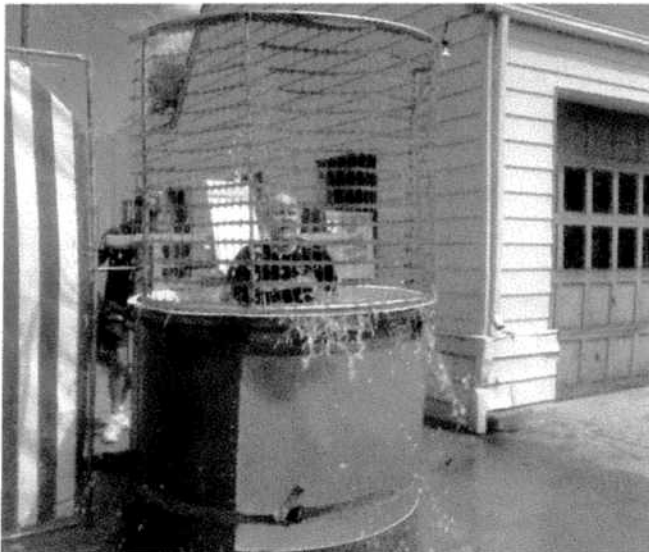

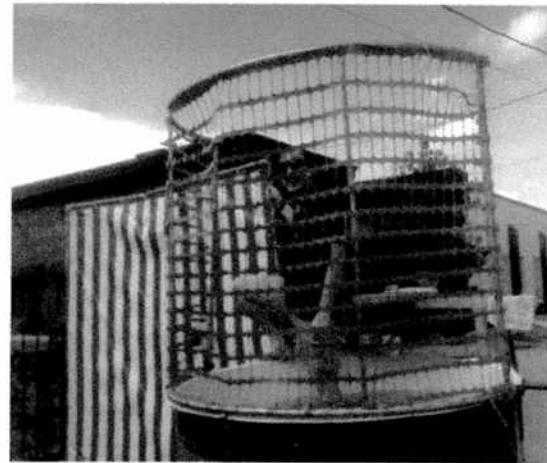

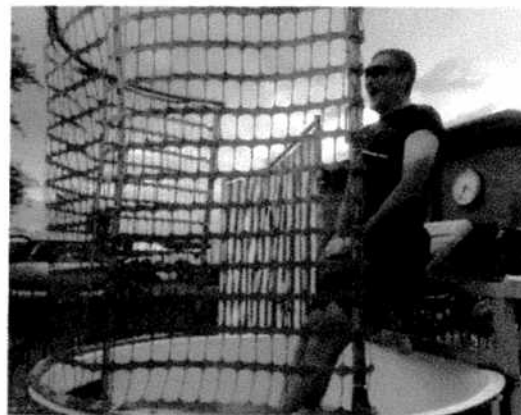
Officer Carlson prepares to launch another one!
